

» Vanderbilt Hall Vanderbilt Hall is a recitation room in the Ashburn Building on the Vanderbilt campus. It is named after railroad president and Vanderbilt University benefactor William R. Jennings. The room is named after Jennings because of the University's interest in providing access to the skills of the past that are now expensive and time-consuming to acquire. Jennings was deeply concerned about the intellectual capacity of his children. He did not want them to be educated merely to be part of the elite. The building was designed by Thomas Walter Lamb, of New York, and completed in 1904. The university began operations in 1873 and the Ashburn Building, built to house the college's administrative offices, was completed in 1904.

The building originally had a 10,000-seat auditorium that was built in the early 1900's. The auditorium was demolished in the early 1970s and a new recitation room was built in its place.

Recitation Room The main purpose of the recitation room is for student recitations or class presentations to the Vanderbilt faculty, using the room's lower-level, front-row seating. Recitation room use is required for all degree-seeking students except freshmen and sophomores. To attend recitation room lectures, a student must sign up for Vanderbilt's Auditors' List. The room is on the first floor of the Ashburn Building. It holds approximately 500-600 students and faculty. History For more than a century, since it opened in 1904, Vanderbilt Hall has been used for daily recitations by the College of Arts and Science, while classes in the Ashburn Building are held in classrooms arranged throughout the building.
